Yukon Party heading toward majority victory in upcoming territorial election

Currie Dixon's Yukon Party positioned to form majority government

Toronto, November 2nd – In a random sampling of public opinion taken by The Forum Poll™ among 697 Yukon voters ahead of the November 3rd territorial election, 48.1% of those who are decided or leaning are likely to vote for the Yukon Party, 39.1% are likely to vote for the New Democratic Party, while 11.9% are likely to vote for the Liberal Party. Voter support is low other parties (0.8%).

Yukon Party projected to win 14 seats; NDP trails with 7

We project 14 seats for the Yukon Party and 7 seats for the NDP. A party must win at least 11 seats to form a majority government.

"Yukon Party appear to be on track to win a majority government," said Dr. Lorne Bozinoff, President of Forum Research. "Under Currie Dixon's leadership, the party has regained momentum and could be on course to form a majority government if current trends hold".

The poll was conducted by Forum Research with the results based on an interactive voice response telephone survey of 697 randomly selected Yukon residents over the age of 18, 86.3% by cellphone and 13.7% on landlines. The poll was conducted from October 30 to November 1, 2025. Results based on the total sample are considered accurate +/- 4.0%, 19 times out of 20.
